## Addendum - Remote Education

- Provide an environment that is regularly risk assessed for the safety of pupils and staff
- Adhere to the social distancing guidelines as set out by the government, as much as we reasonably can
- Support your child's wellbeing, such as by giving them someone to talk to if they feel anxious or overwhelmed
- Contact you if your child displays symptoms of COVID-19, so they can be taken home and can self-isolate
- Inform you if a staff member or child in your child's 'bubble' shows symptoms of COVID-19, and help the NHS test and trace system to get in touch with you if the staff member/child tests positive and the rest of the 'bubble' needs to self-isolate (please note that we will not be able to share any personal details of the person who tested positive)
- Follow and encourage robust hygiene and protective measures, including frequent cleaning and hand washing
- Provide meals as usual during the school day, including free school meals for eligible pupils
- Communicate between home and school through text, email, newsletters, letters and the school website.

- During partial closure, my child is only coming into school because:
  - They are classed as 'vulnerable'
  - I am a critical worker, or my child's other parent/carer is a critical worker, and my child can't stay at home (as a critical worker, I understand I should keep my child at home if I can, according to the government)
- I need to monitor if my child or anyone in our household has symptoms of COVID-19 (e.g. a high temperature; a new, continuous cough; or a loss or change to their sense of smell/taste)
- If my child or anyone in our household shows symptoms of COVID-19, I will not send them to school and we will selfisolate for the appropriate length of time set out by the government
- If my child shows symptoms of COVID-19 in school, I will collect my child as soon as possible
- If my child shows symptoms of COVID-19, I will have them take a test and, if they test positive, inform the school and work with the NHS test and trace system to identify anyone who's recently been in close contact with my child (I understand that the school will not share the personal details of anyone who tests positive with others)
- I will do my best to avoid public transport in peak hours when taking my child to and from school, and we will wear face coverings if this isn't possible (unless my child is under the age of 11, as this does not apply to them)
- When dropping off and picking up my child: I will stick to the timings for my child, use the designated entrance, adhere to the social distancing rules set out by the government and leave school immediately after
- I will not enter the school building without a prearranged appointment

- Follow good hygiene practices, including: washing my hands well and often; not touching my eyes, nose or mouth; coughing or sneezing into my elbow or a tissue, and throwing any used tissues in the bin straight away
- Follow my school's behaviour rules as normal.

Remote education for pupils learning at home	<ul> <li>Provide remote learning that supports your child to progress through the school's curriculum.</li> <li>Make alternative arrangements if your child can't access remote learning.</li> <li>Support your child's wellbeing, such as by allowing them to talk with their friends and school staff when possible and celebrating your child's achievements.</li> <li>Provide free school meals to eligible pupils through packages collected or delivered from school or weekly supermarket vouchers.</li> <li>Keep in touch about developments in school through notices, newsletters, text, email and the school website.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>I will do my best to support my child to complete any remote learning work set for them, and get in touch with the school if this won't be possible for any reason.</li> <li>I will make the school aware if my child is sick or otherwise can't complete work.</li> <li>I will seek help from the school if I need it by contacting the class teacher via Seesaw, emailing the admin office or phoning the office.</li> <li>I will respect the privacy of my child's teachers by not recording lessons and sharing them on social media.</li> <li>Live sessions are designed to be between teachers and pupils, so I will wait for a suitable time to ask questions to avoid interrupting teaching.</li> <li>I will be respectful when making any complaints or concerns known to staff and will follow the appropriate channels to do so.</li> </ul>	Complete any work set by my teachers on time  Ask my teacher for help if I need it  Let my teachers know if I'm not able to complete my work  Follow my school's behaviour rules during remote sessions or groups
