Welcome back

It's been a delight to have children return to school this week and enjoy a school day that finally feels 'normal'. We have been very impressed with the enthusiasm and maturity demonstrated by all pupils as they return to a routine that is new for many and a distant memory for others. Children have been able to experience playtime with other classes and year groups, whole school assemblies and dining together in the Hall at lunchtime.

Coronavirus Actions

Operating instructions for schools have been further eased along with national guidance. Please remember that coronavirus continues to be present in the community and we must all continue to take appropriate steps to reduce transmission.

We continue to follow national guidance to reduce the likelihood of coronavirus infection. Good hygiene practices are followed, all rooms are well ventilated and school staff continue to take lateral flow tests at least twice each week. Our measures will be adjusted according to revisions in government advice for the safety of pupils, staff and parents.

If your child is unwell, consult the <u>NHS</u> "Is my child too ill for school?" guide to decide whether they need to stay at home. Within this you will find an explanation of whether isolation is required. If you cannot find the right medical advice online, call 111.

School Lunches

Our new catering provider, Pabulum, have been providing freshly prepared hot food for children this week. If your child has already eaten a hot lunch this week, we hope that their meal was tasty, nutritious and filling. If your child hasn't yet tried a school lunch and you would like them to, they simply need to choose a school meal when asked by their teacher at the start of the day. Please remember that school meals are chargeable and you must pay for these in advance via ScoPay. We invited all parents to sign up with a letter at the start of this week - if you have not received a copy, please email a request to the school office. Drop off and Collection

Our drop off and collection routines have been very successful this week and this arrangement will continue for the foreseeable future. We hope that you have found the return to one drop off time to be beneficial.

When you collect your child from the playground after school, please do not allow children to climb on the trim trail or other fixed furniture. The trim trail is for use by Junior pupils only, during school time and when supervised by school staff – this is clearly explained on the adjacent signage. For their safety, children must please avoid climbing on other external furniture or trees.

Portrait photographs

Individual and sibling school photographs will be taken on 22 September. Class photographs will be taken on 19th May 2022. All children are required to wear their school uniform, as explained on the Uniform page of the school website.

Village Connect Trail

The Village Connect Trail is a walking route on mainly footpaths, covering 16 miles in length connecting Hartley Wintney, Hook and Odiham and has been produced as a post COVID opportunity for our communities to get out in the fresh air and raise money through sponsorship for our local schools.

The Hook & Odiham Lions Club and Rotary Club of Odiham and Hook have organised this event with the help of other Village Connect partners and schools, and like other charitable organisations have had almost no fund-raising events for more than a year but identified this opportunity to assist local schools directly, who themselves have faced quite unique challenges during the pandemic. The event will take place on 25th and 26th September 2021 and start at a place on the route and a time of your choosing.


