Governing Body News

A huge welcome back to everyone at school, we hope that you had a great summer break. We held our first full governor meeting of the new academic year on Tuesday 14th September and were pleased to hear that everyone has returned to the school with a high level of enthusiasm. There has also been lots of positive feedback about the new catering arrangements with children enjoying fresh food and an improved dining experience.

We also welcomed Tom Shedden as our new Co-Opted Governor. Tom is a History teacher at Lord Wandsworth College, where he is currently also a Houseparent, running a senior boys' boarding house of around 80 boys aged 11-18. A keen sportsman, he coaches senior rugby and cricket teams and plays a wide range of sports. Tom has two daughters; both educated locally and is currently completing a Masters in Pastoral Leadership. We look forward to the skills and experience that Tom will bring to the Governing Body.

With regards to the structure of the Governing Board, following the departure of Teri Viney and Darren Myles. the Governors have appointed me as Chair and Chris Bass as Vice Chair. A massive thank you to Teri and Darren for their significant contribution to the school over many years. There are currently 3 Governor vacancies of which one is for a Parent Governor. Therefore, we will be holding a Parent Election during the Autumn term so look out for further communication on this in the coming few weeks. Parking during drop off and collection

We hope that you are finding the return to one drop off and collection time convenient. With a higher concentration of visitors to the school, parking spaces in the Community Centre car park are in higher demand. The Community Centre car park is a shared space that can be used by parents and also by others using community centre facilities, Hartlett's cafe and Hartlett's park.

All parents and children are encouraged to walk to school when possible. If you do need to drive, please be considerate of those who are also entitled to use the car park and for nearby residents for whom access to their properties should not be obstructed. When parents and children are walking to and from school, they will need to make full use of the footpaths and we ask that you do not obstruct these paths when parking.

Coronavirus Actions

Operating instructions for schools have been further eased along with national guidance. Please remember that coronavirus continues to be present in the community and we must all continue to take appropriate steps to reduce transmission.

We continue to follow national guidance to reduce the likelihood of coronavirus infection. Good hygiene practices are followed, all rooms are well ventilated and school staff continue to take lateral flow tests at least twice each week. Our measures will be adjusted according to revisions in government advice for the safety of pupils, staff and parents.

If your child is unwell, consult the <u>NHS</u> "Is my child too ill for school?" guide to decide whether they need to stay at home. Within this you will find <u>an explanation of whether isolation is required</u>. If you cannot find the right medical advice online, call 111.

School Meals

Our new catering provider, Pabulum, have been providing freshly prepared hot food for children this term. If your child has already eaten a hot lunch at school, we hope that their meal was tasty, nutritious and filling. If your child hasn't yet tried a school lunch and you would like them to, they simply need to choose a school meal when asked by their teacher at the start of the day. Please remember that school meals cost £2.50 each and you must pay for these in advance via ScoPay. We invited all parents to register for Scopay access with a letter at the start of this term - if you have not received a copy, please email a request to the school office. Scopay can be configured to send you an alert when your child's meal balance is low - read how to setup an alert and learn about other Scopay features in the Parent FAQ (the alert feature is item number 24). More information about our school meals and copies of the menu can be found on the School Meals page of the school website.

Clubs

We have updated the list of clubs currently on offer before, during and after school. <u>Visit the Clubs page in the Parents section of our website to learn more</u>. Clubs are facilitated by third parties and you should contact the facilitator directly to make an enquiry, book a place or make a payment.

Bikeability for Year 6 Pupils

Pupils in year 6 have been invited to participate in a <u>Bikeability</u> course during the autumn half term week. This free to attend training provides children with the essential skills required to safely and capably ride their bike on the road. Bikeability sessions are funded by the Department for Transport and in some regions funding is supplemented by the local authority and local organisations. Bikeability sessions are always in high demand and places are limited - for much of the pandemic we have been unable to offer Bikeability training. To enable all year groups to benefit, including those who have been unable to participate due to the pandemic, the initial offer is for year 6 pupil only – other year groups will be invited to attend later in the academic year.

Communication with Parents

Your contact details have been added to our email and text messaging systems. If we need to send you an urgent message, we will do this with our 'Teachers2Parents' system. We will send you a regular email each week alerting you to this newsletter and occasional other messages to inform you of other school news, activities or invitations.

Teachers2Parents offer an IOS and Android app for use on mobile devices, however we *do not* recommend that you use this and instead only rely on receiving text messages from us. If you install the Teachers2Parents app, it is possible that urgent text messages from us will not be displayed on your mobile device.

Please remember that we often send directed communication to specific year groups. When this is the case, messages and included content are intended for a specific audience only – this includes those shared via text message, email, SeeSaw and invitations to Teams meetings shared with a hyperlink. To avoid confusion and ensure that the message(s) remain with the correct audience, please do not forward / recirculate / share links with other parents. If you think you have missed a communication from us, please contact the office in the first instance.

Portrait photographs

All children will have a portrait photograph taken when the school photographer visits on 22 September. Please ensure that your child is dressed in their full school uniform, <u>as explained in the Parents section of the school website</u>.

Children in class 5JH, 5LO, 6TC and 6LE should wear school uniform to school and bring their PE kit in a bag.

Class photographs will be taken on 19th May 2022.


