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From the Chair of Governors

Dear Parents and Carers,

We held our first Governor Body meeting of the new academic year this week. There is lots of positivity about the year ahead for everyone connected with the school and It was a pleasure to hear how well our new pupils and members of staff are settling in. The key focus of the meeting was to agree the school strategic plan that covers every aspect of school life, also to confirm our Governor roles for this year and approve important statutory polices.

A number of the Governors also joined the staff inset day at the beginning of September for annual Safeguarding and Child Protection training delivered by Brightcore. Safeguarding is critical to ensure that we provide a safe environment, safe practices and educate about risks and safety for all children to enable them to thrive at and beyond school. We take this responsibility extremely seriously and the safeguarding role the school plays within school and the local community is vital for children, their parents and carers. The school has a strong culture of safeguarding, which is recognised by Ofsted 2023, staff and governors are not complacent, we recognise how small incidents can create a bigger and broader picture when it comes to protecting children. The Governing body also approved our Child Protection Policy and Safeguarding Policy which have been updated in line with Keeping children Safe in Education 2023 and are available for you to read via the Policies page on our website.

What parents and carers need to know about WhatsApp

Year 6 Secondary school applications are now open

Parents and carers with children due to move to secondary school next year can now <u>apply for their child's school place for</u> <u>September 2024</u>. Secondary school applications are open until 31 October.

Applications can be submitted online, while paper forms can be requested by emailing admissions.team@hants.gov.uk.

Please follow the below guidance when submitting your application:

- Name three schools on your application to give you the best chance of being offered a place at one of your preferred schools
- Submit your application on time, before the 31 October deadline
- Use the County Council's school catchment area finder to check the catchment school for your address

- Read the schools' admissions policies and look at previous years' admissions data to get an indication of how many places schools can allocate and the criteria that will be used to allocate places
- Think about how your child will get to school. See the <u>travel to school</u> pages to help plan your journey and find out if you are eligible for help with transport. You must name your catchment school as one of your preferences if you wish to apply for transport assistance

Where three schools are named on applications, very few children are not offered a place at one of these preferences. Should a place be offered at an alternative school, this would be because each of the three chosen schools received more applications than the number of available places, and the child did not rank high enough in accordance with the oversubscription criteria to qualify for a place. In these circumstances, the child would be added to a waiting list for the next available space. Often spaces become available because families move home or decide on different schools. Any parent who is unhappy with the place that has been allocated for their child can appeal against the decision.

Parents who apply online can log back into the system to amend their applications at any time before the closing date on 31 October 2023. Applications must be resubmitted after making any changes. Anyone who needs to make changes to a paper application should contact <u>admissions.team@hants.gov.uk</u>.

Parents who have applied online and on time will be notified of the outcome of their application on 1 March 2024 and two to three working days later by letter if they applied using a paper form.

Parking outside the school gates

Please be mindful that the cones we have placed in the spaces immediately outside the school vehicular and pedestrian gate are intended to prevent recurring near misses when children and parents are entering and leaving the school grounds at busy times. We will be grateful if anyone transporting children would please refrain from using these spaces. Permanent bollards will soon be installed in each of the spaces where temporary cones are already present to further improve safety for anyone arriving at or leaving the school grounds.

When waiting to enter the school grounds, with or without your child, we encourage all pedestrians to wait on footpaths and not in the flow of traffic – this includes waiting on the new path adjacent to the skate park which the Parish Council have kindly installed as part of the skate park development project to provide a safe path for pedestrians.

Our school vehicular gates are the only route of access for emergency vehicles and we request that they are not obstructed at any time.

HCC Family Information and Services Hub


