Completed late forms can be returned to any Hampshire school or the County Admissions Team. Please ensure that you date stamp any forms received in school on receipt and forward them to the admissions team as quickly as possible.

# Year 6 Natural History Museum Evolution Workshop

Year 6 are learning about Evolution. This week, Matt, from the Natural History Museum kindly ran workshops for each class to tell us all about the topic. We explored the following questions: What is evolution? How does it happen? Why does it happen?

We were presented with lots of exciting information. We learnt when different species were around and when they first existed. As the time of evolution takes generations, we split the evolution timeline into 3 periods. This helped us understand how far apart different and new life is formed. We were all shocked when we found out that grass hadn't been around too long before humans. Matt even told us about an experiment that scientists have been working on: they have sent some scientists to an island to learn about the current evolution happening with lizards. They have taken the prints of the lizards and 40% of them have large toes that makes them slower, yet they have a stronger grip. 60% of them have spread out, smaller feet, so they can move faster. We looked at how - if there was a storm – which lizard type would most likely survive, as well as other factors, like if there was a hawk. We looked at different stages of how the Earth looked and we worked out how animals have changed over time. We understood how they changed their appearance to adapt to their surroundings. We are all very grateful for the natural history museum for giving us this experience!

# A Reminder of PE Kit Requirements

On those days when children have PE, they should arrive at school wearing the PE kit described below instead of their regular school uniform.

Our PE kit expectations are <u>clearly explained on the Uniform page of our website</u>.

All children are required to wear an appropriate combination of the following upper body and lower body PE kit:

- White short- sleeve polo shirt bearing the Hook Junior School logo in the appropriate House colour
- Navy branded shorts, or plain navy unbranded short; navy branded or plain navy unbranded skort; navy branded tracksuit or plain unbranded tracksuit
- White sports socks
- Black, grey or navy trainers

An optional navy tracksuit, formed of navy top and bottoms may be worn for some outside activities during the winter months.

The following items **do not** form part of the school PE uniform and must not be worn or taken to school by any child:

- Any shirt bearing a logo, brand or other visual or graphical element
- Any shorts bearing a logo, brand or other visual or graphical element
- Trainers must be smart and appropriate for physical activity

# **RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch**

Across the UK, over half a million people took part in Big Garden Birdwatch 2023, counting a whopping 9.1 million birds! House Sparrows took the top spot, but counts of these chirpy birds are down by 57% compared to the first Birdwatch in 1979. In fact, we've lost 38 million birds from UK skies in the last 60 years. With birds facing so many challenges, it's more important than ever to get involved in the Birdwatch. Every bird you do – or don't – count will give us a valuable insight into how garden birds are faring.

The RSPB are once again asking people to take part in the Big Garden Birdwatch, which runs from Friday 26th to Sunday 28th January this year. This is entirely optional, but I know that some children will be keen to take part. You can sign up and participate by visiting the <u>Big Garden Birdwatch page on the RSPB</u> website. Spend just one hour watching the birds in your garden and record the birds that land. Full


instructions are on the RSPB website. Your results must be shared with the RSPB, either by recording online, or by post. The RSPB uses your birdwatch results to assist them in gathering data about the birds in the U.K.

We've included a recipe for a bird feeder at the end of this newsletter which you may like to make at home to attract more species of birds.

# Make a birdcake

Just as the name says, this is quick and easy to make. Hang it up and feed the birds this winter.



# You will need:

- Good quality bird seed
- Raisins
- 110/04/14
- Peanuts
- Grated cheese
- Suet or lard at room temperature
- Yogurt pots/plastic cups
- String
- · Jung
- Mixing bowl
  Wooden spoon
- Moonen sh
- Scissors





Make a small hole in the bottom of the pot/cup. Thread a long piece of string through the hole and tie a sizeable knot on the inside. Leave enough string so that you can tie the pot to a tree or bird table.



2 Chop the lard into pieces and put in the bowl, mixing thoroughly with the other ingredients.





- 3 Spoon the bird cake mix into the pots. If you can, put them in a fridge for an hour or two to set.
- 4 Hang your speedy bird cakes up. Will birds such as blue tits come to feed? Wait and see!
