Over the Easter break our poly tunnel was assembled and is being prepared for planting. We have already received donations of tomato plants from members of the community – if you have any surplus vegetable plants at home, please do send them in to school for children to care for and grow. We would also like to hear from anyone with experience in gardening or vegetable growing to volunteer regularly for an hour or

two each week and help our young gardeners get started - please contact the school office if you would like to get involved.

You may have noticed that during the Easter break the large wooden play frame has been removed from the school playground. This was unfortunately due to the equipment no longer being safe for use, nor were we able to replace it with something similar in the same location. Children are benefitting from the extra playground space this has provided and we hope that in future we can install new outdoor play equipment for pupils to enjoy.

#### **Clothing Bank**



A clothing bank has been installed outside the main pedestrian school gate. Any clothing donated here will earn a small return for the school and funds raised will be reinvested for the benefit of children, as is the case for similar collections organised by the HSCA (which will continue on a termly basis).

You **can** deposit the following wearable items:

- · All men's, ladies and children's clothing
- Paired Shoes

- · Handbags, bags, ties and belts
- Bed clothes, towels, soft toys

You cannot deposit the following (the school won't be paid anything if you do!):

- · Duvets both synthetic and feathered
- Pillows & cushions
- Carpets & Rugs
- · Soiled or wet clothing
- Workwear
- Branded school clothes (pass these to the HSCA for their pre-loved uniform sale)
- Shredded or mutilated textile material
- · Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

#### Pabulum School Lunches

This week we had to make a last-minute change to the school meal offer on Monday morning as our refrigerator experienced a fault and food was not safe to eat. Temporary arrangements are now in place

and menu options from Tuesday onward have been unaffected. We are sorry if your child was unable to enjoy the lunch they were expecting on Monday.

The <u>school meals page on our website</u> has been updated to include a visual, photographic menu – all meals on offer are displayed visually with a photograph. We hope you find this a useful reference at home. Children will be shown a visual menu in class by their teacher when ordering a meal during registration.

#### Supporting Pupils with Additional Needs

We are advised by Hampshire County Council that we are no longer permitted to make Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) referrals for Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). Where a child is suspected to have ADHD, a referral can only be made through a GP, rather than via schools. CAMHS referrals can still be made by school for mental health concerns and autism.

#### Crossways Parking Permits

Parking permits have arrived in the Infant School office for Crossways car park, courtesy of Hart District Council and Hook Parish Council.

If you would like a permit and would benefit from parking at Crossways car park, please call in to the Infant school office to collect one – only a limited number of permits are available. To receive a permit, you will be required to provide your vehicle registration and your child's name.

Permits grant parking for the morning and afternoon school visits and are only valid whilst your child is at Hook Infant School or Hook Junior School.

#### Robert Mays School Transition

Robert Mays School <u>have published a transition website</u> to support pupils as they move from Hook Junior School to Robert Mays School. The site includes welcome messages from staff and pupils, an introduction to day-to-day life at school, frequently asked questions, subject specific information and more.

#### Cemetery Footpath to Church View


