The Fowl Twins





Now someone... or something, is stirring. And it is looking for Aveline






Not long after he starts work, a summer storm leads to flooding in the mine. Trapped down in the dark, George spots a shadowy figure that seems to be telling George to follow him.




Todd and Laurie's dad is either on top of the world, taking them on fun adventures, or down in the depths and sleeping all the time.





Donut has just received the best news of her life -- she's been accepted to Lionheart School for Heroes!


But her parents are the most infamous villains around, and her best friend, Ivy, can't understand why Donut would choose a life of boring heroism and ruin their plans to cause chaos.
