Important Seesaw Information

Some Seesaw users noticed that the Messages function was not working this week and we learn from the Seesaw team that this was intentional while they resolved a security issue.

The following notice has been released by the Seesaw team:

We are writing to let you know about an incident that occurred related to Seesaw, the actions that were taken, and how seriously both the entire Seesaw team takes this incident.

What happened

On the morning of 15 September, we learned that a link to an inappropriate message was being shared via the Messages feature within Seesaw. The Seesaw platform itself was not compromised, however specific individual user accounts were used to send this inappropriate message.

The incident was led by an outside actor (meaning that the inappropriate message was not created by the sender of the message or by the school). It occurred as a result of a coordinated external attempt to guess user account passwords associated with this group of user accounts.

What actions were taken

The Seesaw team has taken several immediate actions to contain and address this issue. Messages was turned OFF for all users while the issue was investigated. It will be enabled again only after taking the necessary actions to ensure the security of accounts. To learn more about the details of what action was taken, you can visit status.seesaw.me

- *It is essential that you always use best practices to ensure your password is [secure](#).*

- *We recommend that you refresh your web browser and if using Seesaw on a mobile device, you can update your device to the latest app version (version 8.1.2, released today) and re-launch Seesaw or close and re-open the Seesaw app (Here are instructions to close [iOS](#) and [Android](#) devices).*

Lateness and Punctuality

It is important to be on time at the start of the morning and afternoon school sessions. If a child is late they miss work, time with their class teacher getting vital information, cause disruption to the

lesson for others, and this can lead to personal embarrassment leading to possible further absence.

- The school gates are open from 8:30 am and all pupils are expected to be in school before the gates shut at 8:38 a.m.
- Children arriving after 8.46am will be marked as 'late before registration closes'. If they arrive after 8.55am they will be marked as 'late after registration closes' which will count as an unauthorised absence.
- All lateness is recorded daily, it will be analysed daily and action taken if necessary. This information will be required by the courts, should a prosecution for non-attendance or lateness be necessary.
- Arrival after the close of registration will be marked as unauthorised absence code 'U' in line with county and Department for Education (DfE) guidance. This mark shows them to be on site but is legally recorded as an absence.
- If a pupil is late due to a medical appointment, they will receive an authorised absence coded 'M'. Where possible doctors and dentists' appointments are encouraged to be made outside of school hours or during school holidays.
- Pupils who are consistently late are disrupting not only their own education but also that of the other pupils.
- On-going and repeated lateness is considered as unauthorised absence and will be subject to legal action.

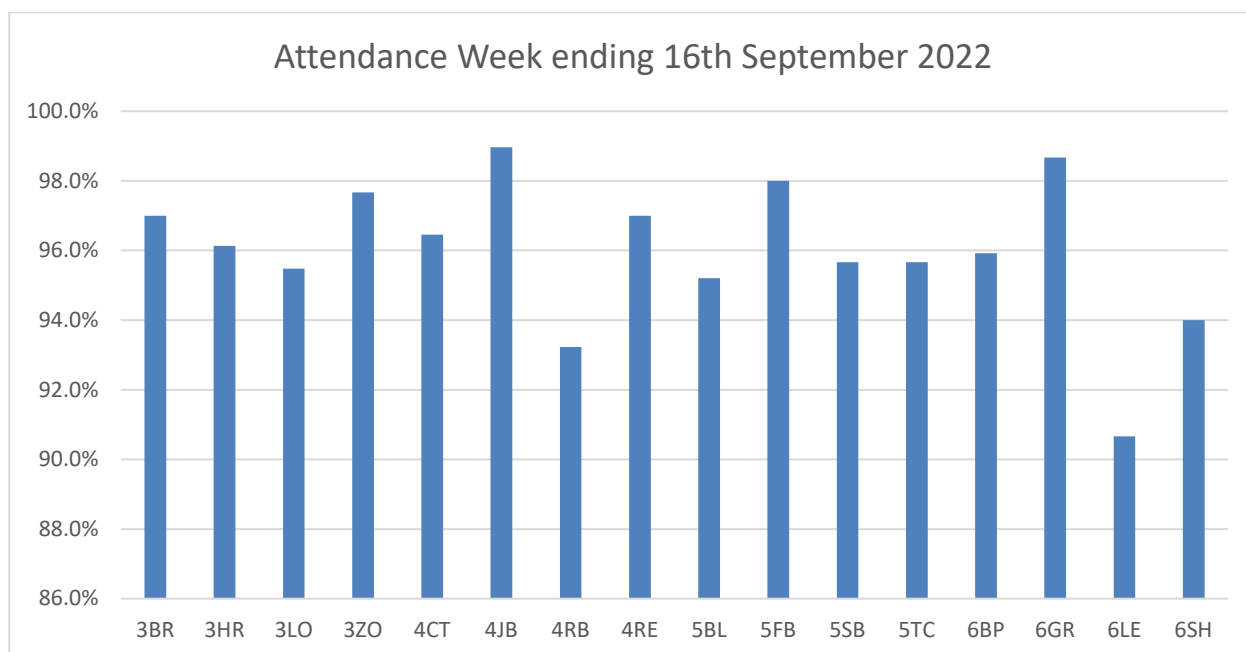
