Friday 24 March 2023 Update from the Governors

We wish to thank school leaders and staff for doing all they could to keep the school open and maintain our children's education, during recent NEU strike action. Industrial action and pay disputes are very difficult times for those involved and can open up the difference in opinion and objectives. A reminder of the importance of living the school's core values: Responsibility, Respect, Inclusion and Empathy.

Towards the end of Autumn term, the school and governing body undertook a parent survey. Thank you to all of you who took the time to respond.

The results were overall very positive. Some 98% of you are confident that their child is taught well at the school, and the school helps develop skills in communication, reading, writing and mathematics, and 91% would recommend the school to another parent. The written feedback has been particularly helpful in putting the responses in context, and also have helped Mrs Martin and the leadership team take some immediate steps to respond to issues raised.

Having reviewed and discussed the results, the key area of focus identified where we would like to improve before the next survey is Communications, which had the lowest score (80%) across any of those asked, and also showed a drop compared to pre-Covid. A number of changes have already been made to improve in this area, which I hope you have seen the benefits of. We will continue this focus through the full school year.

The children supporting on the side-lines also showed great sportsmanship, cheering for their teams but also encouraging the others. Austen were the overall winners, with Wellington coming second.

Our netball team have been training incredibly hard this year. A selection went to a tournament on Tuesday at Elvetham Heath where they played 4 matches. They showed excellent resilience and determination, working well as a team and showing great tactics which resulted in them winning 3 out of the 4 games. Another selection went to our first league match on Wednesday after school. The team were incredible, showing initiative in finding space as well as superb interception skills, allowing them to maintain control of the game throughout. They came away winning 23 - 1, a fantastic first league game

result. Both Miss Bowyer and I have been very proud of them all so far, and we are excited for the upcoming games to see what more they can achieve.

After being postponed due to the snow last time, we were thrilled to be able to participate in the rearranged event on Wednesday lunchtime. There was an amazing turnout of girls that came to join in, with over 120 taking part over the hour. Some children spent the time practising their passing and dribbling skills, and others took part in some mini matches. The children were delighted to have members of staff joining in, especially when Mrs Bailey scored a goal! It was lovely to see so many girls involved and enjoying the event, and there are some excellent footballers coming up through the school!




